# Welcome Guests

We're glad you could be with us today! Please fill out a visitor card, in the foyer, so we can get to know you.

## Children's services available:

- **Nursery** - Birth to Pre-Walkers (located just off the foyer) Pack-n-plays, gliders, and floor mats provided. \*A parent will need to remain in room with their children.
- **Toddler Program** - Proficient Walkers to age 2. Located downstairs in the room next to the Preschool program.
- **Preschool** - potty trained ages 3-4, downstairs in the Pre-K room
- **Elementary classes**
  - **grades K-2 (ages 5-8)**, downstairs classroom, next to kitchen
  - **grades 3-5 (ages 9-11)**, Located upstairs in classroom.

A teacher will be in back of the sanctuary to escort children to their room, and also will bring the children back to be picked up after close of service.

Children's ministry is optional at discretion of parents. Toddler and preschool children may be checked in prior to worship service and elementary groups are dismissed during offering in the order of service (except first Sunday each month when school age children remain in service). Children need to be picked up promptly following service. Children's activity packs and sermon worksheets are available in the foyer for those who prefer to remain during worship and sermon.
